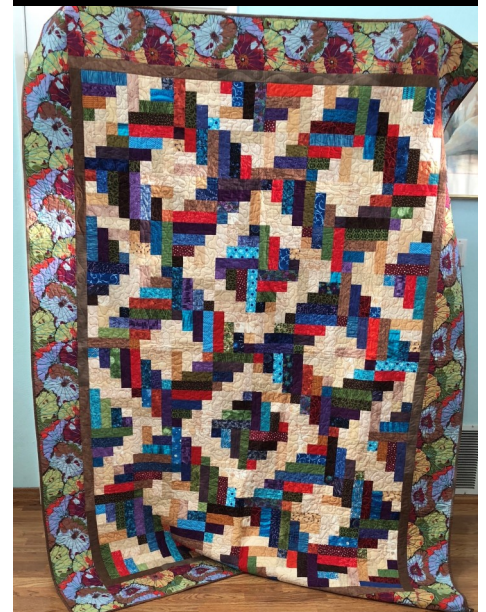

2017 Quilt Donations

Community Quilts has finished 136 quilts for donations in 2017. We gave away 60 in July, to Tri-City Volunteers, Abode Services, LOV Newark, Fremont Human Services, and Kaiser Chaplains. We also plan to send some to Santa Rosa for fire victims, and have donated several to various agencies for their fundraising efforts.

In December, we presented 64 to other local agencies, including Viola Blythe Services in Newark, Kidango, LifeEldercare (Meals on Wheels). Kaiser Chaplains, and Centro de Servicios in Union City.

Guild members can be happy that they have helped to provide warmth and comfort to clients of these agencies in our community.

Block of the Month

February 2018 Block of the Month

Sweet Heart

Finished size 8 inches

This is a 16 patch block with 8 Half Square Triangles (HST), 6 solid red/dark pink squares and 2 white/light pink squares. You can use just two fabrics for this block, a white/light and a dark red (or medium/dark fabric). The white/light fabric is your background and the dark (or medium dark) fabric is your heart.

1. Cut 4 white/light and 4 red dark/medium dark squares at 3 inches square ($2\frac{7}{8}$ for those folks who do not want to trim down their HSTs). Place one white/light square and one dark square right sides together. Draw a diagonal line on the white/light square corner to corner. You will sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam along each side of the drawn line. Then cut along the drawn line and you will have two half square triangles (HSTs) which will give you the required 8 HST blocks. Make sure to square up your HSTs to measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches square.
2. Cut six $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares of your dark/medium dark red fabric.
3. Cut two $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares of your white/light fabric.
4. Arrange your HSTs and squares according to the diagram below to produce your Sweet Heart block.

Your Sweet Heart block should now measure $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches square when sewn together

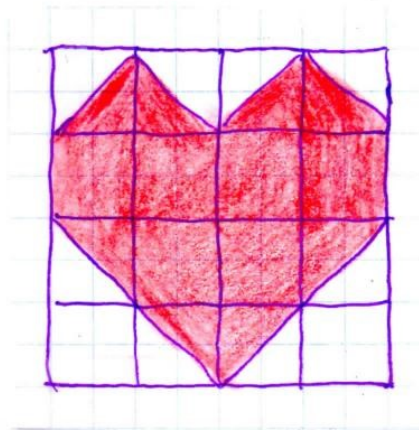
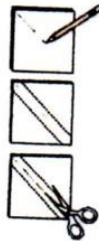
Triangle-Squares. With right sides together and the lighter fabric on top, pair one square of each color that makes the unit. On the lighter patch, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner.

Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " out from both sides of the line.

Cut apart on the marked line.

With the darker fabric up, open out the top patch and press the block.

A pair of squares will yield 2 units.
