We will also do the Big Reveal for our 2018 Opportunity Quilt! Many hands created this masterpiece. Special thanks to Linda Probst and Kathleen Murtha for coordinating. On February 10, we will enjoy the Laura Nownes "Wedges" workshop, which has a \$55 fee and includes a ruler. There is still room for you to enjoy this class. The February Me-Retreat is waiting-list only.

I'm happy to report that most of our committee chairpersons will continue. Linda Marglon and Shirley Froidevaux have agreed to chair Ways 'n' Means officially. Carlene Stoffers has agreed to do our Show 'n' Tell raffle. We need someone to coordinate marketing for our 2018 Opportunity Quilt. Sue Whatley and Aileen Fox will go to venues. Would you enjoy this volunteer opportunity?

Each leader and member brings a different background

to our quilting and volunteering. My educational background is teaching and ministry. Both professions require figuring out how to work with people when there is no monetary compensation. I'm wondering, what motivates each of you to volunteer, quilt, and be part of Piecemakers? Please take some time to answer this question for yourself. Our guild has lost several of our movers and shakers in recent years to death or moves outside the Bay Area. At the same time, we have gained wonderful new members who have stepped up into key volunteer positions. Volunteers make it possible for us to create and share our beautiful quilts, provide educational activities, give away several hundreds of quilts annually, pay bills, eat, and enjoy fun quilting events together. Recently though, I have been hearing committees say, "We need more help!"

Within the life of organizations, it becomes important to ask, "Is this still working? Do we need to continue this?" We aren't at the point of stopping any of

our activities. However, we will have to cut back on activities if more help isn't provided.

There are 2 critical creative volunteer areas that we invite each of you to ponder enjoying: Community Quilts and our Quilt Show. To maintain our tax-exempt status, we need to give away quilts and provide educational events. Community Quilts and our Quilt Show fulfill these requirements. What help might you enjoy providing?

If you like working in small groups, please consider joining Community Quilts, who meet periodically to cut batting, make binding, cut fabric into kits, teach simple quilt patterns, tie quilts, make backs and quilt tops, and sort donated fabric. If you prefer to work at home or elsewhere, most of the above quilting tasks are still options. You can also commit to completing a top or tops from the kits that are available at every meeting. There is a huge need for quilting finished tops.

While our Quilt Show isn't until July, a lot of prep work is required. In the past, we expected members to

volunteer at least 10 hours in Quilt Show years. Now we need and encourage you to help as able. We need volunteers to enjoy creating items for the Boutique. Enjoy the free workshops to make items that will profit the guild entirely or enjoy having your own hand-crafted items sold with profit split between you and the guild. Donate something wonderful for the raffle baskets or a themed basket with friends. On the actual Quilt Show days, we hope everyone will enjoy volunteering.

Please think about how much time you could commit per week or month to help Community Quilts and/or the Quilt Show. Determine what volunteering brings you the greatest joy. Contact our leaders with your pledge to help. Follow through with your commitment. No pressure. This is an Invitation to enjoy volunteering. Let leaders know they can count on you. Community Quilt Sizes

Here are some suggestions for those of you making tops and finished quilts for donations.

Under 36 x 40 is an appropriate size for newborns. Pick up a kit from Evelyn or make one on your own.

40-48" wide x 55-60" long: these are the best sizes for agencies. Either use bright colors for young children, prints for teens, or fabric that will be attractive to seniors needing a lap quilt.

50-55" wide x 65-70" long: For active adults or teens for napping. Welcome by all agencies.

We give Kaiser chaplains only quilts that are machine quilted. They go on the foot of beds for those at the end of life. Anything from 40 x 55 to 50 x 65 would be appropriate; use calming or cheerful fabrics.

Anything larger or smaller can be given to some agencies, as everyone welcomes one of our quilts. Especially nice machine-quilted quilts can be given to an agency as a raffle or auction item.

You don't have to stay for the whole day. If you only have two hours, just drop in and sit a spell and enjoy the "Sisterhood".

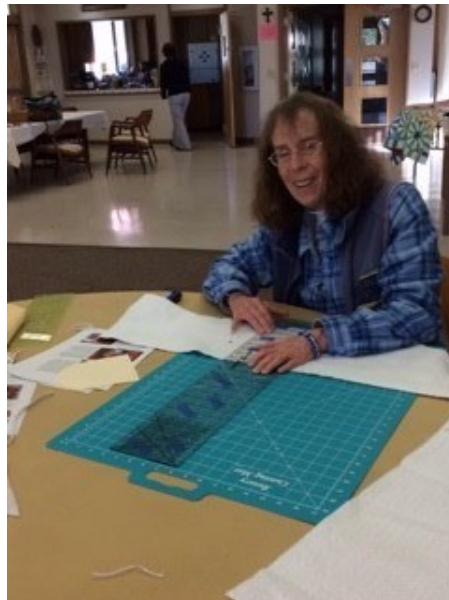
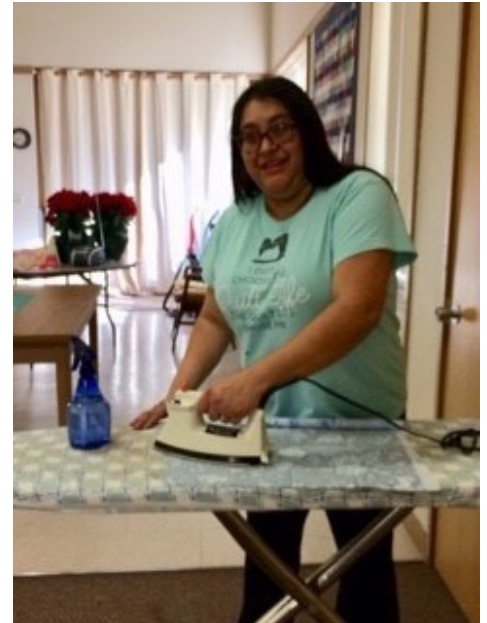

January 16, 2018

Called to order: 7:00

Secretary: The minutes will be sent to board members for approval. If changes are needed, the secretary will summarize the changes when sending out the final version for final approval.

President: The bank account signatures have been updated. The procedure to do this has been added to the President's notebook.

Most committee chairmen have confirmed that they will continue in their roles. Darlene Cano will serve as greeter in addition to Membership chair. Carlene Stoffers will be Show and Tell chair. Hospitality, library, webmaster, Ways and Means, and Opportunity Quilt marketing still need to be confirmed.

A calendar of Guild activities was distributed. K.K. will keep this calendar up-to-date, and provide a subset of it showing only the activities that will take place at the church. Cindy Sojourner and Aileen Fox will meet with the church to schedule our use of the building for the year, and to finalize the rental agreement. Cindy verified that our insurance applies to all of our events at any location, and to all attendees, including non-members. We need to renew our insurance riders for events at Homewood Suites and the Dominican Center.

When setting up for Guild meetings, we will need a round table for periodicals or fabric

sales.

Everyone's contributions to make the January Guild meeting a success are appreciated.

VP1: Dawn reported that 10 people are signed up for Laura Nownes' workshop on February 10. Dawn has rulers to distribute. Participants will have to prepare and cut fabric in advance. K.K. will unlock the church and help set up.

The February speaker will be Vicki Johnson, who sews modern and artistic quilts with painting and printing techniques.

VP2: Linda Probst will coordinate with K.K. to determine non-speaker programs for the year.

Treasurer: Jan is still closing December's books. She will post the year-end report in our February newsletter. The checking account balance is approximately \$14,000.

Motion by Darlene Cano and K.K. Kaneshiro, seconded by Elin Thomas, to donate \$100 each to the San Jose and National Quilt Museums. The motion carried.

Membership: Darlene reported that we have 84 paid members. People have indicated an interest in modern quilting. That choice and possibly others will be added to next year's membership form.

Community Quilts: We are looking for ideas to draw people to work parties. The mile-a-minute demonstrations were popular last year. Some ideas are to demonstrate machine quilting on newborn quilts, and to take sign-ups for work parties. Dawn plans to join Community Quilts when she is

done with her responsibilities for programs. The committee is in need of additional members.

The guild needs an adjustable table to use for cutting. Amy Gunnarson will purchase it from Costco if it is available. The expense has already been approved.

Newsletter: deadline for articles is January 26. The directory of committee chairmen will be updated as changes are confirmed.

Quilt Show: There will be a Boutique workshop January 20 at 11 am. Elin will write a newsletter article. Pat will begin to take volunteer sign-ups at the February Guild meeting. Elin has applied to Kaiser for a grant. Other ideas for grants are Candle Lighters, Chase Bank, and Niles Rotary.

Opportunity Quilt: The 2018 quilt is back from the quilter. Kathy Murtha will make the binding and label. Linda Probst will add the sleeve. A motion was made by Cindy Sojourner, seconded by K.K. Kaneshiro, to purchase a display frame for it, up to \$200. The motion carried. The finished quilt will be displayed at the February Guild meeting. Aileen Fox will order raffle tickets for it.

A pattern for the 2019 Opportunity Quilt has been donated by Lisa Norton, and her sister, Lora Zmak has offered to quilt it. K.K. Kaneshiro made a motion to approve the design, and Darlene Cano seconded the motion. The motion carried. Linda Probst will chair the 2019 Opportunity Quilt development.

Block of the Month

March 2018 Block of the Month

Single Irish Chain

Finished Size 10 inches square



Background fabric: white or cream

Main Fabric: Medium to dark green

You will need:

4 - 2.5 inch x 6.5 inch rectangles of background fabric

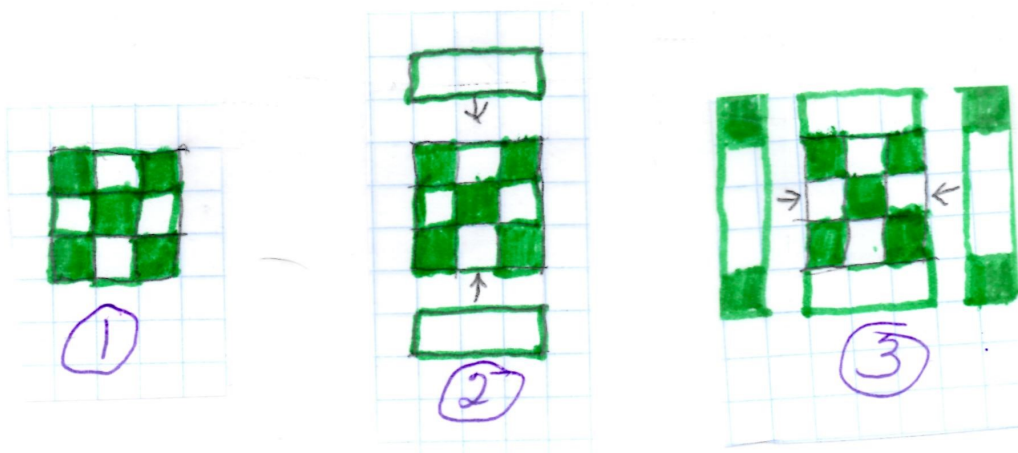
4 - 2.5 inch squares of background fabric

9 - 2.5 inch squares of green fabric

Assemble your block as follows:

- ① Sew a 9 patch block together with five green squares and four background squares according to the diagram below.
- ② Sew a 2.5 inch x 6.5 inch rectangle of your background fabric to the top and bottom of your nine patch. This will be the center section of your chain block.
- ③ Now sew a green 2.5 inch square onto the short ends (the top and the bottom) of each of your two remaining background rectangles. You now have all three sections of your block completed. Sew these three sections together according to the diagram below. Your block should now measure 10.5 inches (unfinished).

Hooray – a Single Irish Chain block has been born! Next step: turn it in at the March guild meeting in hopes of winning ALL the blocks.
